

## **NIMAS Podcast Intro**

The NIMAS 2006 Workshop, held at the Fountains Conference Center in Carmel Indiana on October 18 was audio-recorded by PATINS-Project staff. This audio recording was edited and divided into six episodes or segments available for download as individual mp3 files or as a subscription (podcast) to all six of the current files **and also** to all future NIMAS related recordings that are produced. ## **What is a Podcast**

Podcast is a term that was originally coined on Feb. 12, 2004 by Ben Hammersley. It refers to both the content and the delivery method. A podcast is different from a direct download or even streaming content. With podcasts, content is automatically downloaded by certain pieces of software that collect or read an RSS feed. RSS generally refers to "Really Simple Syndication." These programs that collect RSS feeds are often called feed readers or more commonly, podcast aggregators. A few common aggregators are, iTunes, @Podder and Juice. @Podder is an aggregator specifically designed for the visually impaired. Essentially, by subscribing to a podcast you are setting yourself up to automatically receive new content/episodes as they are produced within that particular podcast. Alternatively, simply downloading an audio file is a one time process that doesn't automatically download anything for you when new content is produced. Subscribing to the NIMAS podcast will ensure that you automatically download all six episodes from the October 18<sup>th</sup> workshop and also any future NIMAS recordings that are produced.
